Previously, he received a Bachelor of Arts in Natural Applied Science, with a focus in Biology and Health and Human Illness, from the University of Southern Maine's Lewiston-Auburn College in 2011.

Cory brings extensive experience caring for patients with substance use disorders in both inpatient and outpatient settings. He provides services to patients experiencing opioid use disorder, in addition to treating alcohol and stimulant use disorders. Alongside the HealthReach team, he will be supporting patients on their journey to recovery by providing medication, behavioral health and support services.
